The Elderly Medication Program (TEMP) aids indigent senior citizens in the acquisition of free life-sustaining medications by assisting them in completing the various pharmaceutical company applications.

Economic Benefits of Forestry BMP'S

Central Mississippi RC&D Jackson, MS

Through cooperation with Mississippi State University, Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and Central Mississippi RC&D Council, a grant was provided by DEQ to address the problem of non-point source pollution. Economic data is being collected and the information will be published in the Mississippi Best Management Practices Handbook, which will be made available to all landowners in Mississippi. The result will be cleaner streams and more productive forestland, preventing pollution and providing better water quality.
